Douglas Scott Agnew, 60 year old Okmulgee resident, passed away Thursday, May 18, 2017 in Okmulgee. He was born June 22, 1956 in Liberal, Kansas to the late Riley Scott and Sally Fischer Agnew. Doug took pride in his career with the Boy Scouts of America. He was proud to have been a Third Generation Eagle Scout. Doug transitioned to full-time volunteer, a role he has enjoyed for over 12 years. Doug and his wife, Ina, moved to Okmulgee in November of 2008 from St. Louis, Missouri. He was very active in the Catholic Community of Okmulgee and Knights of Columbus. Doug also served as a board member of the Okmulgee Homeless Shelter, Friends of the Okmulgee Public Library, was Finance Secretary for the Knights of Columbus, served on the Finance Council at Uganda Martyrs Catholic Church, and volunteered at Open Gate. Doug was also involved in Big Brothers Big Sisters of Oklahoma. He was a handyman that was always willing to help anyone. He was a man of faith, who loved his family and friends deeply. Doug was the ultimate role model. He will be remembered as a good father, husband, son, brother and friend.

He was preceded in death by his parents and a sister, Beth Wills.

Survivors include his wife, Ina (Hopiak) Agnew of the home; sons, Daniel Agnew and wife Allison of Ft. Bragg, North Carolina and grandchildren, Lauren, Taylor and Riley Agnew; Ryan Agnew of Kingwood, Texas; a brother, Marty Agnew and wife Debbie of Lincoln, Nebraska; and, a sister, Cheri Harvey and husband Ray of Shawnee, Oklahoma.
