Lois Kolakowski Walker of Okmulgee entered Beulah Land on Sunday morning June 6th, 2021 after suffering a major stroke. Lois was born in Welty, Oklahoma on September 6th, 1941 to Wilburn and Leora Baldridge and attended school in Nuyaka, Oklahoma where she graduated in 1959. She leaves to mourn her passing; husband Richard of Dewar; sons Terry Baker of Okmulgee and Billy Kolakowski of Tulsa; granddaughter Sommer Frank and grandson Kalem Baker, both of Okmulgee.
