



Charles E. "Chuck" Goldenberg

March 20, 1933 - December 19, 2009

Charles "Chuck" Goldenberg of Miami, Oklahoma died December 19, 2009. He will be remembered as a wonderful husband, father, and friend.

Chuck was born in Kansas City, Missouri on March 20, 1933 to Henry and Sandy Goldenberg. He attended the University of Kansas, graduating in 1955 with a degree in Industrial Management. Following college, he flew F-86 jet fighter aircrafts for the United States Air Force and achieved the rank of Captain.

He moved to Miami, Oklahoma in 1973 with the purchase of Newell Coach Corporation. A few years after selling the company in 1979, Chuck was appointed the President of the First National Bank & Trust Company of Miami and remained in the position for 12 years until 1996.

Chuck was an active member of the community. He served as the President of the Miami Chamber of Commerce and was Chairman of the Committee that started the Miami Area Economic Development Service (MAEDS). In addition, he was on the board of the Baptist Regional Hospital, Baptist Regional Health Care, and the Miami School Enrichment Foundation. The Rotary Club honored him with the Paul Harris Award. He earned the rank of Eagle Scout from the Boy Scouts of America and was honored by them with the Silver Beaver Award.

Chuck married Letty Torchia in 1961. She survives, of the home. He is also survived by his daughter and son-in-law, Jane and Bill Osborn of Miami; another daughter, Nancy Goldenberg of Chicago; his son, John Goldenberg of Sydney, Australia; and his two grandchildren, Ben and Jack Osborn.

Visitation will be held Monday, December 21st at 6 pm at the First Presbyterian Church in Miami, Oklahoma and a memorial service will be held Tuesday, December 22nd at 2 pm also at the First Presbyterian Church in Miami, Oklahoma.
