Charlotte Joan Jandebaur, longtime Tulsa resident, passed away Saturday, December 15, 2018 at her Okmulgee residence. She was born April 26, 1932 in North Platte, Nebraska to the late Doyle and Elnora (Johansen) Burkhart. At the young age of eight, Charlotte met the boy that would become the love of her life, Douglas B. Jandebaur. She remained his steadfast companion throughout life. Motorcycles played an important role in their life, not only in business but in travels throughout the world. They moved their family to Tulsa in December 1959 to open Jandebaur's Honda dealership, selling in 1978. They next began an aviation fueling business, Million Air Tulsa fueling private aircraft, Airlines and military, selling in 2000. In 2010, her oldest son brought back the Jandebaur name as a Motor Sports Park in Okmulgee where in 2015 they moved to a beautiful Farm adjoining the Park.

She was preceded in death by her parents and a grandson, Adam Jandebaur.

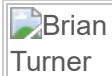
