Deborah "Debbie" Elizabeth Crenshaw, 49, died at her home in Morris on Thursday, March 3, 2011. Debbie was born on January 30, 1962 in Oklahoma City to Teddy Cody Simmons and Terry Elizabeth (Dugger) Smelik.
