Dickey Logan Ashley, 91 year old Morris, Oklahoma area resident, passed away Saturday, December 25, 2021 at his home with his family by his side. Dick was born on May 2, 1930, in Morris, Oklahoma to Daniel S Ashley & Mary Jane Mitchell Ashley. He graduated from Morris High School and went on to study Animal Husbandry at Oklahoma State A&M (OSU). He served in the United States Navy from 1952-1956 during the Korean Conflict and was stationed in Alaska during part of his service. After serving his country, Dick worked for American Airlines for a short time, spent 35 years working for the United States Postal Service and worked for 15 years at Covington Aircraft. He also served with the Okmulgee County Sheriff's Department during the 70's and 80's,

Dick married Dorma Sue Hinchee on January 18, 1957. They were married for 50 years and had 5 children.

Dick is preceded in death by his wife, Sue, on December 16, 2007, his parents, and a son, Steve Ashley.

He is survived by two daughters, Katie and husband Gary Buchanan of Jay, OK, and Sue Anne and husband Terry Morrow of Morris, OK; two sons, Doug Ashley of Okmulgee, OK, and Richard Ashley of Morris, OK; his companion, Ruth Shelton; 11 grandchildren, three great granddaughters and 2 great grandsons.

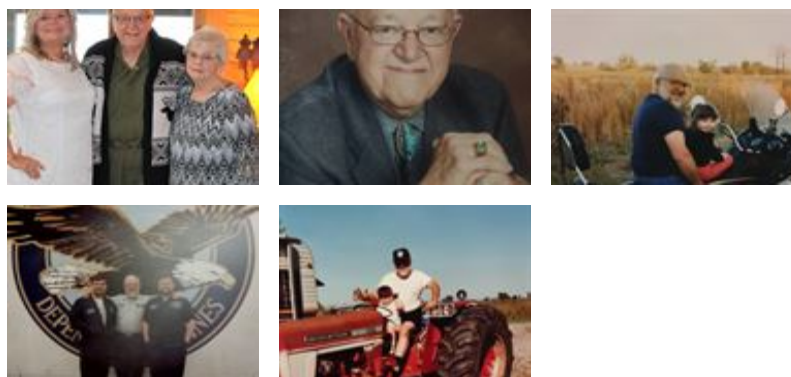
