January 5, 1924 - March 29, 2013

Frank Lester Wilson, 89, longtime Morris resident, died on Friday, March 29, 2013 at the Jack C. Montgomery Veteran's Medical Center in Muskogee. Frank was born January 5, 1924 in Morris to Albert Lester "Shortie" and Edith Wilson. He was a decorated Veteran of the U.S. Army serving in the European theater of World War II supporting forward communications as a sergeant of the 3299th Signal Service Company. He married Lois Ann Leib and after living in several states, they returned to Oklahoma and bought and operated the Dairy Queen in Wewoka. They later returned to Morris to make their home and raise their son. Frank graduated from the University of Oklahoma with a degree in geology. He worked with a mud logging company and was owner operator of other oil field projects until his retirement. He was an avid reader, loved going to air shows and was a connoisseur of fine cigars. He was preceded in death by his parents, wife, sister-in-law, Helen Jean Leib and mother and father-in-law, Rufus and Marjorie Leib. Frank is survived by his son, Frank Wayne Wilson and wife Suzette, a granddaughter, Kira Ann Wilson, a granddaughter, Jackie French and a very special friend, Earline French, all of Okmulgee.

A funeral service will be held 2:00 P.M. Friday, April 5, 2013 at the First Christian Church of Morris. Interment will follow in the Morris Cemetery.
