Franklin M. Moore died Tuesday, July 2, 2013 at 87 years of age. Frank was born September 22, 1925 in Okmulgee to Claude and Cammie (Livingston) Moore. He was a veteran of the United States Air Force and was proud of his service during WWII. He kept in contact with many of his service friends through the years. On July 5, 1952 in Ft.
