October 11, 1933 - November 25, 2013

Harold Talbot, 80, longtime Okmulgee resident, passed away Monday evening, November 25, 2013 at St. John Medical Center in Tulsa. Harold was born October 11, 1933 in McAlester, Oklahoma to Joseph Lawrence and Lilly Etta (Ramsey) Talbot. He married Patricia Ann Clark on October 19, 1951 in Indianola, Oklahoma. Harold worked for 25 years in the insurance industry, mostly for National Life and after retirement he owned a package delivery service.
