



## Isaac "Glenn" Miller

March 3, 1941 - February 14, 2023

Isaac "Glenn" Thomas Miller passed away at his home in Okmulgee on February 14, 2023. Glenn was preceded in death by his wife of over 50 years, Sheila Faye Miller, on March 5, 2012. He was also preceded in death by his parents William Thomas Miller and Cora Winnie Mae (Brumley) Miller, four sisters who passes in infancy and sisters Wilma Ingram and Shirley Fox.

Glenn was born March 3, 1941 in rural Atoka County, Oklahoma. He attended elementary school in Atoka, OK, Roswell NM, Hagerman NM, Durant, OK and Harmony, OK. He attended high school in Atoka.

Glenn joined the Oklahoma National Guard at a young age, serving three years with military police. He then enlisted in the U.S. Navy for four years while serving on the USS Finch DER 328, the USS Charles Brannon DE 446, and the USS Watts DD567. As a sonar man, he completed his service as SOG2, 2nd Class, E5, petty officer 58 whole Battalion.

While stationed in Seattle, in 1960, Glenn met the love of his life, Sheila Faye Massey. They were married October 21, 1961, in San Diego, CA where he was later stationed. After completing active duty, Glenn took Sheila back to his home town of Atoka. He converted to his wife's religion of Catholicism and they got married again in the Catholic Church.

In June of 1964, Glenn, Sheila and infant daughter, Shannon, moved to Okmulgee where he was employed at East Central Electric. Their family

quickly expanded to include Glenn, Jr., David, and DeLisa. He worked for East Central Electric for over 33 years before retiring on January 1, 1998.

While living in Okmulgee, Glenn became very involved with community service. He was a member of the Okmulgee Jaycees, serving as President twice and state Vice-President once. As a member of St. Anthony's Church, he was also in the Knights of Columbus. In the mid to late 70's, Glenn served on the Okmulgee City Council for two terms, during the time the city was involved with big projects, such as the development of Kiddy's Lake, the establishment of the city's 911 system and the development and building of Dripping Springs.

In his retirement, Glenn was a member of the Henryetta Gold and County Club where he discovered his love for playing golf. He won several trophies throughout the years until his health prevented him from playing.

Glenn is survived by his daughters, Shannon Christine Miller Coy of Okmulgee, DeLisa Kaye Miller of Tulsa, sons, Isaac Glenn Thomas Miller, Jr., of Lexington, GA and David Wayne Miller of Okmulgee. He is also survived by sisters Joyce Woodall and Sharon Mast, 15 grandchildren, 39 great grandchildren and many nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.

A memorial service will be held at 11:00 AM on Saturday, February 18, 2023 at the McClendon-Winters Funeral Home Chapel in Okmulgee, OK.
