James Edward "Ed" Robinson died at home on Thursday, August 16, 2012 at 60 years of age. Ed was born March 2, 1952 in Amarillo, Texas to James Ervin and Betty Sue (Walker) Robinson. He worked many years as the Director of Maintenance of the Okmulgee Memorial Hospital. Ed loved fishing. His father James Robinson preceded him in death.
