Lewis Alvin Watts, a resident of Okmulgee passed away on February 2, 2018 at the age of 70 years 9 months and 12 days in Okmulgee. He was born to Berlin Watts and Juanita Allred on April 4, 1947, the third child of four. Lewis graduated from Morris High School in 1966.
