May 16, 1930 - May 7, 2021

Mary Lucile Garrison, longtime Oklahoma City resident, passed away Friday, May 7, 2021 at Legend at Tulsa Hills. She would have celebrated her ninety-first birthday on May 16. Lu was born in 1930 to the late David Matthew and Jeanette Lucile (Cole) Logan in Okmulgee. She graduated from Okmulgee High School in 1948. Lu worked for over twenty-five years at the Oklahoma Department of Human Services. She was an active member of the All Souls Episcopal Church in Oklahoma City, where she was involved in Daughters of the King, Foyer Group Supper Club, The Outreach Committee and was a Greeter. Lu was extremely active in numerous organizations, where she held many offices over the years. These organizations include Oklahoma City Philharmonic, Oklahoma Symphony Show House, The Lyric Theatre of Oklahoma City, Mayfair Dance Club, P.E.O., Aquarius Book Club, Oklahoma County Medical Society Alliance, Twentieth Century Club, English Speaking Union, Pi Beta Phi Oklahoma City Alumnae Club, Girl's Night Out, Pen and Quill Book Club, 20th Century Club, Blue Flower Garden Club, Tuesday Book Club, and numerous Bridge Clubs. They were also former members of Oklahoma City Golf and Country Club and Quail Creek Golf and Country Club. Lu was a graduate and avid University of Oklahoma fan. She was a member of the Pi Beta Phi Sorority at OU, pledge class of 1949. In 2005, Lu was honored as Pi Phi Panhellenic Woman of the Year.

Lu was preceded in death by her parents, husband of thirty years, George Bolar Garrison, M.D. and a brother, David L. Logan.
