



## Lynn Allwyn Edenborough

September 8, 1911 - August 17, 2011

Lynn Allwyn Edenborough died Wednesday, August 16, 2011 in Houston, Texas. He was just 3 weeks short of his 100th birthday (September 8, 1911). Lynn was born in Shattuck, Oklahoma to the late Neville Bolton and Lou Ellen (Parker) Edenborough. He had lived in Okmulgee since 1936, working at his first job after college with Public Service Co of Oklahoma until retirement in 1976. He began as a junior engineer, rising to be the District Manager, Okmulgee District.

All of his friends called him Lynn, and he had many friends. He and his wife, Mary Dolores (James) Edenborough (Dee) loved Okmulgee. They were active in many organizations including the First Presbyterian Church, Lions Club, Service Club and the Masonic Lodge. He was a 33rd Degree Mason.

He is survived by his two children, Neville and Mary Lynn (Edenborough) Randall, four grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren. Dad enjoyed them all.

After retirement he began a new career with stained glass. He did beautiful work and a number of homes in Okmulgee have his windows. He loved doing stained glass works for family, so most family members have his work. He always talked about the "family rate", which usually was free.

Services will be held 1:00 P.M., Saturday, August 20, 2011 at the McClendon-Winters Funeral Home Chapel with Reverend Jennifer Grantham officiating. He will be buried in Okmulgee Cemetery next to his beloved wife. We will all miss his wonderful ways and wise council. Arrangements are under the
