Robert Glenn Peeler (Bob) passed away Thursday morning, July 9, 2020 in Okmulgee, Ok. He was born on December 17, 1930 in Okmulgee, Ok to Roy and Vada Peeler. Graduated from Okmulgee High School in 1949 and enrolled at Draughons Business College in Tulsa, where he met Barbara Ann Woody from Hugo, OK. Bob joined the Air Force and was stationed at Wichita Falls, Texas. He and Barbara were married November 10, 1951 and lived in Wichita Falls till 1955, then moved back to Okmulgee. Bob worked at American Saint Gobain for 25 years. When the plant closed he went into the Dump truck-backhoe business for 13 years and also raised Quarter horses. in 1988 he opened the B&B car wash on South Wood Drive and sold it October 17, 2006.

He is preceded in death by wife Barbara, son Robert Peeler, parents Roy and Vada, brothers Bill Peeler and Jack Peeler. He is survived by his son Rick and wife Cynthia Peeler of Broken Arrow, four grandsons Austen and Mason of Edmond and Cody of Broken Arrow and Cory of Irvine, California.
