Troy Dock Wagoner, age 77, passed away on June 6, 2026, at Clarehouse in Tulsa, Oklahoma. He was born on November 30, 1948, in Okmulgee, Oklahoma, to Troy J. Wagoner and Mattie (Nimmo) Hamilton Wagoner.
