October 18, 1924 - January 17, 2013

Virginia Lou Moudy, longtime Okmulgee resident and business owner, died Thursday, January 17, 2013 at Okmulgee Memorial Hospital. She was 88 years of age. Virginia was born October 18, 1924 in Commerce, Oklahoma to the late Elmer and Ella Mathews. She married Milton Moudy on December 23, 1951. Virginia worked for many years as a bank teller. In 1961, she and Milton moved to Okmulgee, and later purchased Key Rexall Drug. She was a member of the First Baptist Church, where she was active in her Sunday School Class, an abstaining member of the Okmulgee Service League, and had been a longtime member of the Okmulgee Memorial Hospital Auxiliary. Virginia was preceded in death by her parents, husband and two brothers, Wayne and Merle Mathews. Survivors include her son and daughter-in-law, Dana and Debbie Moudy, of Okmulgee, a sister, Norma Shannon and husband Joe of Oklahoma City, a grandson, Russell Moudy and wife Crista of Okmulgee, a granddaughter, Nikki Moudy Dreisch and husband Sebastian of Seattle, Washington, great grandchildren, Allysen and Carson Moudy and Ian Dreisch and numerous nieces and nephews.
